COOPER MILL AT CHESTER, NEW JERSEY

Abraham, son of the nephew, operated the mill. The ownership of the mill remained in the Cooper family for three downstream from his location. Upon the death of Nathan, his nephew operated and owned the mill. Later on, that was built by Nathan Cooper in 1826. When Nathan built this mill there were three other mills that existed generations The Cooper Mill is located 1.2 miles west of SR 206 on Black Creek. Originally the mill was a frame structure

that creates an image of a very wealthy miller. He grinds using two runs of stones. The mill produces whole wheat flour and corn meal. The stone building is well maintained by using volunteers. the mill. He dresses out using black trousers as well as a black vest. To top it off, he also wears a black derby hat In 1963 the park acquired the mill and in 1978 the mill was opened to the public. The miller, Ivins Smith, operates still intact. A tunnel under the road connects the mill to the millpond. A turbine was installed in the mill in 1870. long wooden flume that channeled the water from the millpond that was formed by a horseshoe shaped dam that is stones that were powered by a sixteen foot Fitz overshot waterwheel that was installed in 1927.
